View the night sky using the Lawrence Sauter Telescope, located in the domed observatory atop the Eisenhower Community Center (room 329). Under the guidance of trained, knowledgeable volunteers, discover the moon, planets, stars and constellations. The observatory is open on scheduled evenings September-May, and viewing hours vary with the time of sunset. Each evening's viewing is limited to 20 participants. Reservations are required, and can be made by calling 952-988-4074.

Group reservations for girl or boy scouts, other clubs, or class groups are also available. A \$2 donation for adults, \$1 for students, and \$35 for groups is requested. Children must be 7 years or older to attend. When coming to the observatory, dress for the weather since the dome is open to the outdoors. In case of cloudy weather on your viewing night, call 952-988-4018 two hours prior to your viewing, for cancellation information.
